

WHEN MEMBERS NEED EXTRA SUPPORT, WE SWING INTO ACTION

As the Institution currently celebrates its 175th anniversary, it is also timely to note that, for 109 of those years, Support Network has also been helping members and

their families too. Originally 'The Benevolent Fund of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers', Support Network was established in 1913, (through the gift of £1,000 in shares of a member's company), to help the widows and orphans of deceased members and to financially aid those members who could no longer work. At the time there was no welfare state, so members bridged the gap to prevent other members falling into difficulties, and we have been doing that ever since.

Although times have changed, enabling members to help other members is still at the heart of what we do. All of our Trustees are either employees or members of the Institution, with representation across all grades, so we are a truly member-led organisation. We also have a volunteer team of members to deliver our face-to face services, and member donations are fully used as grants and loans back to other members and their families.

We work throughout the world – wherever there are IMechE members. In 2021 we recruited our first international member to the Board, and bridge the geographical gap through using online meetings, so that we are all in the digital room together.

When the pandemic has kept people apart, we have continued working to bridge that sense of isolation, through maintaining social contact and increasing our range of support services. We prioritised relieving the issues that can cause poor mental health and stress and did so with an emphasis on prevention. Our webinar series on financial wellbeing was a particularly popular offering and our sleep support service is growing too.

Good stewardship of our funds through the past decades has provided the opportunity for Support Network to extend our impact by also funding organisations that deliver social improvement in an engineering context. We use member donations to help other members and we use our investment returns to meet our own costs and to also fund organisations which are aligned with our charitable objectives. In this way, and shaped by the UN Sustainable Development Goals, we aim to bridge the gap through supporting STEM focussed international development and education initiatives, as well as helping engineering start-ups and scaling of existing projects, particularly where this also promotes diversity, inclusion and equality and contributes to meeting our climate change responsibilities.

Support Network continues to adapt to emerging and changing needs whilst staying focussed on our original purpose – supporting our members, their families, and their contribution to society.

GOVERNANCE WITHOUT BORDERS

As an international member, I felt I had little knowledge of IMechE Support Network, other than making a voluntary minimum £10 pounds donation each year and during my early careers years, qualifying for a reduced membership subscription fee and receiving associated grant help from Support Network. I got elected as a member of the Board of Trustee in 2021, in the thick of the Covid 19 pandemic.

I had some personal and longterm ambitions for joining Support Network. Firstly, I wanted to learn by working in a non-profit board. Secondly, I am passionate about giving my time and energy to support an important cause, such as assisting students with hardship grants (UK & international) to ensure they complete their Mechanical Engineering programme, plus counselling and employment coaching. The world shows that it is possible to work effectively virtually. The relationship built working with other board trustees has been immeasurable.

After Covid 19, I would like to help Support Network reach out more to UK & international IMechE members/families who are undergoing financial and mental health issues.

I have been delighted to learn of the tremendous impact that the Institution's Support Network delivers, acting as a source of genuine support and kindness to those in need.

We're all responsible for bridging the gap across our membership, this year I've really enjoyed working with Anni to identify all the various ways in which we can also strengthen the links between the Institution and the support network. 2022 will see the launch of a new strategy for the Institution with our core effort focussed on just two clear objectives (1) developing and supporting our members, and (2) maximising their positive impact for the benefit of society.

The role of Support Network on that first objective is clear, but we are also working closely to deliver shared impact. I believe our impact will be greatest if we focus on some key priorities, such as climate and sustainability, future transport, and infectious disease control. The grant I was awarded to see my mother when she had her accident helped greatly to fund the various visits to see her in hospital and I have been able to take her to her out-patient appointments. It relieved a lot of stress for both of us.

Knowing that Mum was in a good space enabled me to focus on landing that new job and to move forward.

GLOBAL REACH

Supporting members and their families in times of need

Support Network developed the foundation funding stream of our work in order to rise to the challenge of using more of our resources for relieving poverty and improving the world through engineering. Accordingly, we can now fund organisations working in a STEM-related way in the areas of international development, education, and/or engineering innovation – areas chosen to also align with the objectives of the IMechE.

During 2021 we made awards to enable:

- ocean plastic recycling and conversion into 3D printer filament in Watamu (Kenya)
- promoting indigenous cotton cultivation in Manipur (India)
- training young people in seed banks in Chhattisgarh (India)
- capacity building for female farmers in West Bengal (India)
- environmental health initiatives in Bamako (Mali)
- equitable access to fertilisers in Macina (Mali)

WHAT ABOUT 2022?


During 2022 Support Network plans to continue our core work whilst responding to additional needs and challenges faced by members and their families. As such we will work to:

Assist with engineering career futures through focussing on our next generation of mechanical engineers both in the UK and internationally, including supporting quality work experience and transition into work programmes.

Expand our foundation funding through increasing the number of grants made and ensuring that each of the strands of education, engineering innovation and international development is supported.

Ensure that diversity & inclusion is at the heart of all that we do through undertaking an equality audit of our organisation and the work that we do.



HOW MEMBERS HELPED IN 2021

LINKING MEMBERS WITH SUPPORT NETWORK

As engineering professionals we are good at solving problems - that is our raison d'être, but when work disappears or other life challenges come along, we can't always solve them without

help, and this is a strange situation to be in for an engineer. Reaching out for help can be daunting. Support Network offers a broad scope of services and as many are delivered by engineers to other engineers, this appealed to me, so I joined as a volunteer.

Nina was the first person I was asked to contact, as she had mortgage pressures following redundancy during the pandemic. Through our conversation I was able to recognise a number of other areas where Support Network could help her, and we did. Being able to bridge the gap between Support Network's services and Nina's need for help was hugely satisfying.



WELLBEING SUPPORT

24 respite, personal alarms and care costs paid for carers to take a break, or to take a trip away with the person they care for.

55 given counselling, funeral costs & bereavement support to help members through close loss or personal crisis.

158 social visits, calls and online contact made by member volunteers to help other members feel less isolated.

275 first-time contacts' problems solved with casework



PRACTICAL HELP

75 supported with employment coaching. Working with our career and CV specialists, we helped members and their dependants to regain work.

137 used the legal helpline & factsheets for advice on employment, family, tax, probate etc.

11 supported with health, disability, autism and dyslexia related costs and/or access to support.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

102 Breathing Space grants to help pay members' essential bills in times of financial stress.

130 Fuel and Winter Warmth grants given to older members on fixed incomes to pay fuel costs.

76 housing costs and repair payments given to members in need

9 secured loans either issued or increased helping members make repairs or disability-related adaptations to their homes.

18 student and apprentice grants helped student and apprentice members to focus more time on their studies.

18 parenting support and children's activities for families to keep going during difficult times.


14 newly-qualified grants assisted new graduates and apprentices transitioning into work.

12 Covid-related grants supported members through the pandemic.

We provided 101 grants and employment assistance to support members in 15 countries outside the UK, totalling £53.445. This meant 11.6% of our total expenditure went directly to help non-UK members and this figure represented 13.5% of all grants made during 2021.
